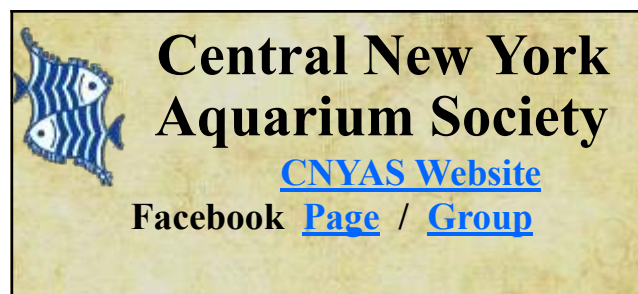

Project Piaba: is a fishery initiative located on the Rio Negro tributary of the Amazon River. The program both promotes and researches sustainable aquarium pet fish collection and its impact on the environment. The name of the project comes from the Brazilian Portuguese word, *piaba* ['pjabɐ], which means "little fish", referring specifically to the cardinal tetra (*Paracheirodon axelrodi*). Project Piaba is an ongoing project with annual research expeditions to the Rio Negro region. Because of the sustainable nature of the project, its slogan is "Buy a Fish, Save a Tree!"

Convention Report: Ohio Cichlid Association Extravaganza 2024 Part Two: The Shop Hop and Ohio Fish Rescue

In last month's *Reflector*, I reported on the Ohio Cichlid Association Extravaganza convention that has been held every year the weekend before Thanksgiving for the past thirty years. I arrived in Strongsville, Ohio the day before the start of the convention in order to allow time to check out the local fish stores (LFS) and to see the Ohio Fish Rescue (OFR) facility. Joe Doyle, well-known Pittsburgh-based hobbyist and speaker, arranged the shop hop tour. He created not only a complete itinerary including the shops and addresses to be visited and a breakfast break, but also a schedule and time allowed for each stop. We needed to return to the hotel by late afternoon in order to not miss the first convention speaker.

Our first stop was Something Fishy, owned by David Hale.

David, who has been in the hobby for 47 years and in the fish business for 33 years, owns a hatchery, aquarium maintenance service business and the retail store. He has collected fish in Africa and South America, and his business's motto is "Rare breed local fish store." He was kind enough to open his retail store, in business at the current location for five years, early just for us. It's a small store but wow, he really knows how to pack in both supplies and livestock. David has the best selection of Tanganyikan cichlids I've ever seen in any store no matter the size.

As luck would have it, I was running out of dry fish food right about the time of the convention, so I took a shopping list with me to the shop hop. No store had every food I was looking for, but all three stores had some of the food, and I was pleased to be able to support the LFS's by making a purchase at each store.

At Something Fishy I purchased the 8 ounce container of Xtreme Community Crave flakes and the 20 ounce Xtreme Cichlid Pee-Wee pellets. I keep track of my fish food purchases and found that Something Fishy's price for the Community Crave was in line with other LFS's and online. His price for the Cichlid Pee-Wee was 30% less than what I paid on amazon.com in July 2024!

Next stop was Perkins American Food, aka Perkins Pancake House, for breakfast, except I had already eaten breakfast at the hotel, so I just concentrated on conversing with the other dozen attendees. Everyone said the service and food was great, and Perkins even agreed to provide separate checks. I sat across from Dave Costa, the President of the Motor City Aquarium Society; he told me he attends the OCA to get ideas and contacts for meeting speakers. I followed Dave's lead by meeting and getting email addresses and leads for speakers for our meetings. Sitting right next to me was one of the best sources of aquarium society speakers, the afore-mentioned Joe Doyle. Another person of interest I met was Tim Sippel who constructed a separate building on his property in Cranberry Township, Pennsylvania just to house his fish hobby. He's in the business of building commercial fish farms for others. Sounds like he would have an interesting presentation, so I made sure to get his phone number. Geoff Humes, the President of the Greater Pittsburgh Aquarium Society Inc., has this bumper sticker on the back of his truck: "My fish think I'm cool." Even if my fish don't have that opinion of me, I want that bumper sticker!

Breakfast concluded, we made our way to RMS, a local fish store that has been in business for 40 years. This was by far the largest of the three stores we visited, and it also features small animals and supplies in addition to fish. I purchased cans of 17.64 ounce Northfin Cichlid Formula pellets and 8.82 ounce Northfin Bug Pro pellets at prices competitive with other LFS's.

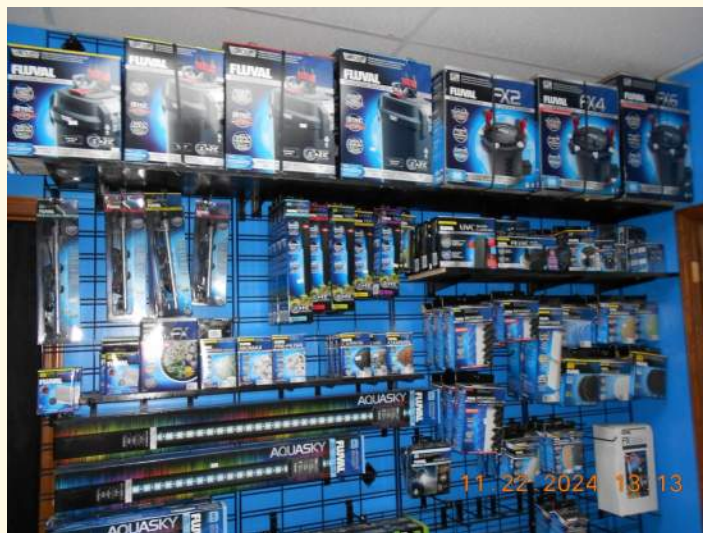


And when you're done exploring RMS, you can take it easy on the customer couch, as Tom Clinton and Mike Thompson from the Akron Aquarium Society are doing

The final store for the day was Agnoquatics, another small hobbyist-owned LFS. In business since 2019, Alecia, the co-owner, told me that they specialize in personal service and helping hobbyist newbies with the nitrogen cycle. Like any good fish store, Agnoquatics has each tank on its own separate water management system to prevent the spread of disease. They are an Xtreme, Fluval, Oase and Aquarium Co-op dealer. Like Something Fishy, the first store we visited, Agnoquatics packs a lot of dry goods and livestock in a small space. To complete all items on my shopping list, I bought a 20 ounce can of Xtreme Nice pellets and an 8 ounce can of Xtreme Krill Flakes, in both cases for less than I paid for previous online purchases.



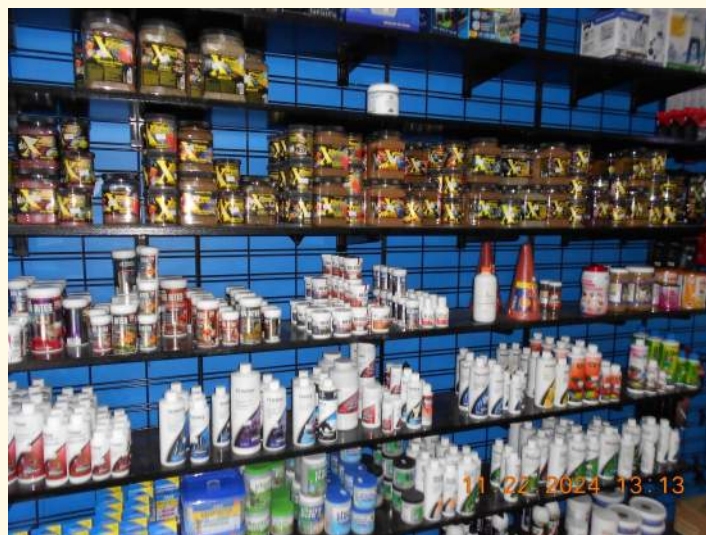

The OFR is a non-profit whose purpose is to rescue fish that are too big and rehome them where the fish will be loved. While some fish are rehomed to public aquariums, most go to private homes where the owner wants and has the facility to house a large fish. OFR sells these fish and charges enough to make it uneconomical for the buyer to flip them. The OFR is located in a residential home that has an indoor swimming pool that has been converted to a super-size aquarium. All tanks feature a central water change system and independent filtration.

FISH FRIENDS FROM AFAR #31 EXCHANGE REPORT

We welcome the **Greater Akron Aquarium Society's *Tank Topics*** to the CNYAS exchange review family. GAAS, founded in 1952, has earned its reputation as one of the premier aquarium societies in the U.S. Each year it sponsors the largest species show in the country, Ultra-Aqua. I remember when I was a member of the Greater Pittsburgh Aquarium Society Inc. in the early 1980s, GAAS would invite our club to their shops and members' fish rooms. It was always an impressive sight! The January issue of *Tank Topics* included a recap of the 2024 activity, including complete results of the bowl show, list of the many BAP/HAP submissions for the year and winners in all 55 classes of the 2024 Ultra-Aqua. It's an active aquarium society!

**“*Xiphophorus alvarezii* (Species Review)” by Rich Serva
Tanks Topics, Greater Akron Aquarium Society, January 2025**

When most aquarists think of swordtails, they think of the ever-popular *Xiphophorus helleri*. Rich explains that there is much more to *Xiphophorus* than just *helleri*. “The Trans-Mexican Volcanic Belt (TMV) in the state of Veracruz is an important divide and barrier separating many groups of Mexican fish.” There are three species of swordtails north of the TMV and five to the south. *X. alvarezii* is rather uncommon in the hobby now. Rich says these swordtails do best in tanks of 30 gallon breeder size and larger, and “as with many swordtails, adults will chase fry at first, but the cannibalism lessens as the adults get used to juveniles in the tank.” He includes three photos of *X. alvarezii*.

**“The Joys of Daphnia” by Horst Gerber
Modern Aquarium, Greater City Aquarium Society, December 2024**

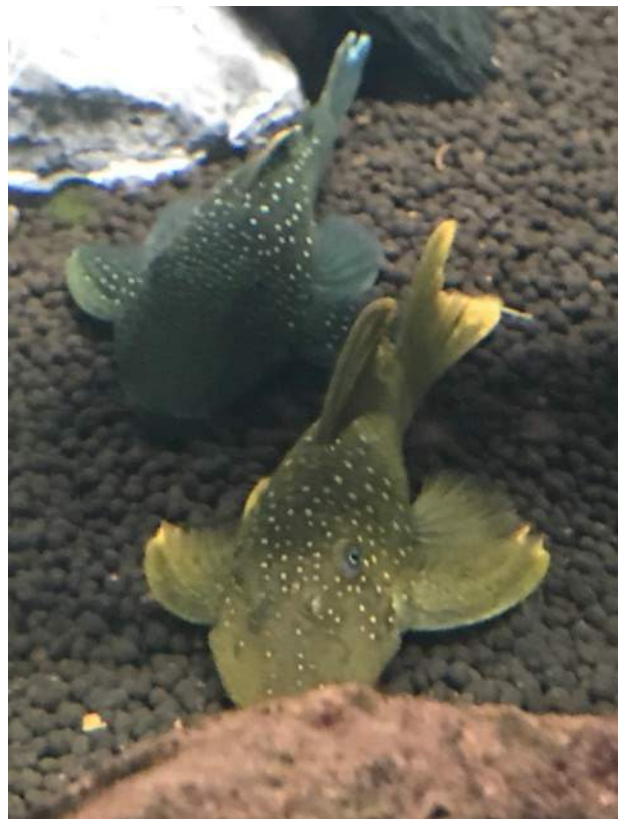
We all know that live food is best for our fish, but it is very unusual to find live daphnia for sale at a pet shop. Horst collected his daphnia from a park and “that culture has been going summer and winter in my back yard for more than ten years.” He doesn't give the reader many details of how he maintains this culture; I'm hoping he'll fill us in in a future article. He warns against collecting mosquito larvae, which often coexist with the daphnia. The problem isn't the mosquitos per se, since they are also a superb live food. The trick is to separate the mosquitos from the daphnia so they can be fed to the fish before they reach their biting adult stage. Live daphnia do occasionally show up in club auctions. “After seeing the results of keeping a supply of daphnia you'll see why many of our members swear by them.”

Texas Caviar

Ingredients

- 1 can pinto beans
- 1 can black eye peas
- 1 can white or yellow kernel corn
- 1 jalapeño pepper, minced
- 1 green pepper, diced small
- 1 medium red onion, diced small
- 1/2 c sugar
- 1/2 c apple cider vinegar
- 1/2 c canola oil

Directions

Combine sugar, vinegar, and oil in a small saucepan and bring to a boil. Remove from heat.

Combine remaining ingredients in a medium sized bowl.

Pour warmed dressing over bean mixture and stir to combine.

Serve with tortilla chips or as a salad side.
