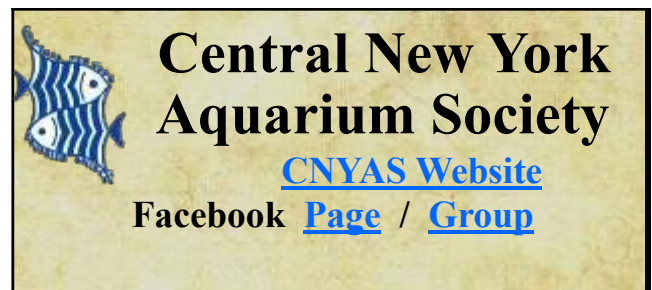

From Wikipedia:

Project *Piaba*: is a fishery initiative located on the Rio Negro tributary of the Amazon River. The program both promotes and researches sustainable aquarium pet fish collection and its impact on the environment. The name of the project comes from the Brazilian Portuguese word, *piaba* ['pjabɐ], which means "little fish", referring specifically to the cardinal tetra (*Paracheirodon axelrodi*). Project *Piaba* is an ongoing project with annual research expeditions to the Rio Negro region. Because of the sustainable nature of the project, its slogan is "Buy a Fish, Save a Tree!"

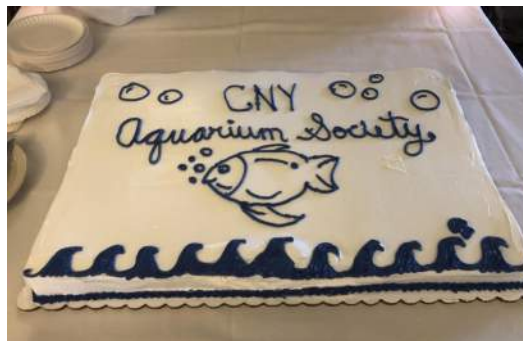

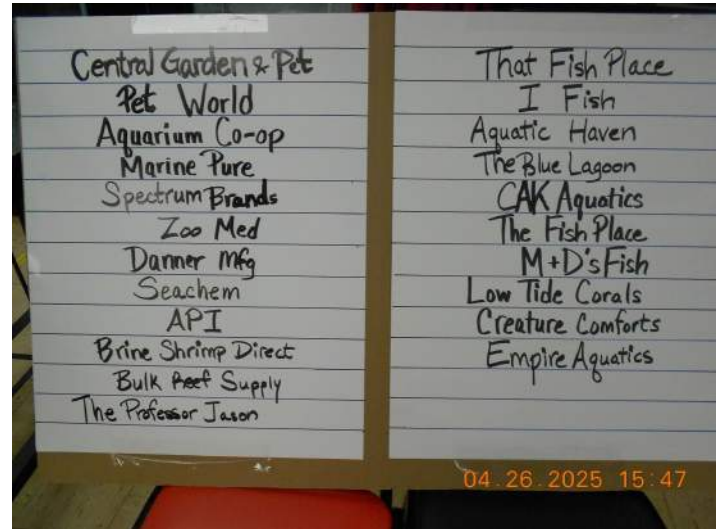

EXCHANGE REPORT

“Finally” by Bill Duzen

***Some Things Fishy*, Tropical Fish Club of Erie County, April 2025**

Some people are really lucky and their fish spawn without the aquarist even trying. I regret I’m not in the “really lucky” group. But Bill Duzen is. Although he’s been keeping bristlenose plecos for years, he was “always using the plecos as a cleaning crew.” After relieving the three of them of their latest cleaning crew duties, he placed them in a 10 gallon tank where “they were forgotten except I would throw some food in the tank and do weekly water changes.” What happened next was—you guessed it—eggs, but only two fry survived. Spurred on by this mini-success, Bill got serious and removed all snails from the tank [*Exchange editor note to Bill: you need to write an article on how you were able to remove 100% all snails from a tank!*], did a 50% water change and started a regimen of frozen foods and quality flake food. Success followed, and Bill fed the ½" fry newly-hatched brine shrimp and pearl dry food. “So after 60 years of fish keeping my quest is finally accomplished. Now I have the urge to breed other plecos. How hard can it be?” Ha ha, Bill, “How hard can it be?” I’m speaking as one of those *not* “really lucky” fish breeders, and you crack me up!

“My Hillstream Loach Set Up” by Mark Allar

***Tropiquarium*, Motor City Aquarium Society, May 2025**

Loaches, especially hillstream loaches, are gaining in popularity due to their fun behavior and generally peaceful disposition. What I didn’t know was that these fish, *Sewellia lineolata*, can be bred in the home aquarium. Mark spawned them. He set up a 5-gallon tank with a thin layer of fine sand, smooth rocks, sponge filter, moss and no heater. Mark fed them a variety of flake and frozen foods along with live black worms. “I never saw the eggs because they were deposited in the sand somewhere in the tank.” The adults did not eat the fry, and now the fish are ready to be moved to a larger tank.

“Aquarium Keeping History: Organization Newsletters and Magazines” by Zenin Skomorowski

***Fins and Tales*, Kitchener-Waterloo Aquarium Society, May 2025**

Zenin has been reviewing aquarium history, and in this edition he focuses on ten magazines from different publishers from the 1970s through the 1990s. After briefly stating the history of the publication, he provides a short description of the articles in each. “Published material was the go-to for updates on fish keeping and breeding. 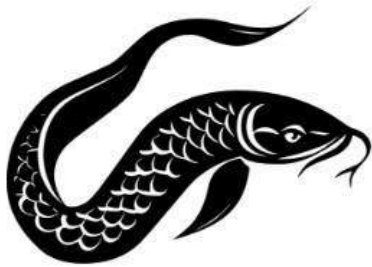

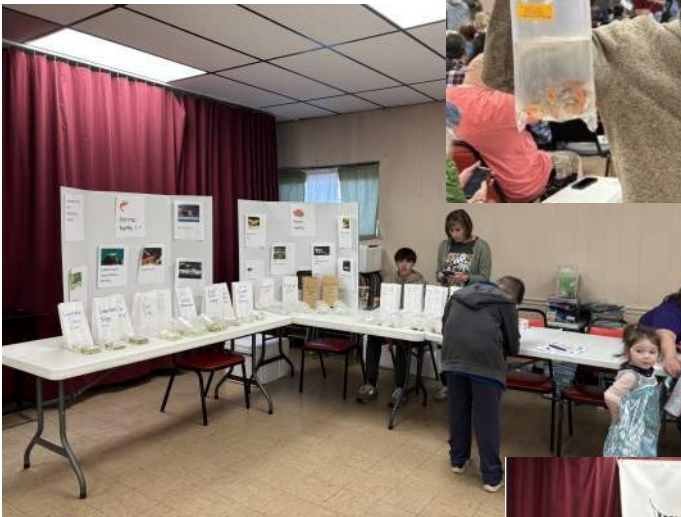
